

ART LEXING Announces Solo Exhibition "The Modern Utopia" by artist Lu Chengxiang at Mandarin Oriental Miami during Art Basel Miami Beach

Guests of Mandarin Oriental, Miami have the opportunity to experience contemporary Asian art during a special exhibition titled, "The Modern Utopia" on view in the hotel's MO Bar + Lounge debuting at the prestigious Art Basel Miami Beach on December 1-15, 2014. The exhibition celebrates the hotel's Asian roots and nods to the expanding cultural interest and influence of eastern art

Organized by Lexing Zhang of ART LEXÏNG Gallery of Miami, the Mandarin Oriental exhibition will feature works by acclaimed Chinese artist Lu Chengxiang, who treads the boundary between old and new. Chengxiang's ink paintings subtly introduce the restlessness of modernity into traditionally-inspired scenarios.

"The Modern Utopia" exhibition collectively illustrates Chengxiang's own portals between time periods and aesthetic methodologies. Symbols of prosperity, luck, wisdom and immortality flow freely through his paintings. One work depicts a typical man of the moment riding into view atop a giant crane. In the realms of Chinese mythology (and accepted among more than sixty ethnic groups throughout mainland China), the crane was connected to ideas of immortality or the transformed "xian" (Taoist immortal) who could fly between worlds both seen and unseen. Chengxiang dresses his crane-rider in a typical schoolboy uniform: he simultaneously addresses the vivaciousness of youth and how time seems endless in the mind of a child. These encapsulated fantasies, collectively called The Modern Utopia, are Chengxiang's own portals between time periods and aesthetic methodologies. Each circular painting is a strange gateway for the contemporary observer, where the final destination is a benevolent one, but not fully known or understood. Symbols of prosperity, luck, wisdom, and immortality flow freely through these delicate rounds, but Chengxiang's fantastic situations provide only short lapses of escape. His quotidian figures and present-day limousines, backpacks, and school uniforms are sharp reminders that the fantasy cannot be maintained as long as the mythologies they call upon.

The results are haunting juxtapositions which contrast the harmony of uniformity against the fundamental beauty of uniqueness, triggering a powerful emotional response where predictability proves to be both beautiful and mystic. His pieces are thought-provoking manifestations ripe with pan-cultural significance, not to be missed during this first-ever Miami debut.
